
Hold Funeral Services for Jos. H. Cherney of Stangelville

Funeral services for Joseph H. Cherney, 76, who died last week Tuesday morning after a heart attack, following a two months' illness, were held at the home in Stangelville at 9:15 last Friday morning and at 9:30 at the St. Lawrence church at Stangelville with the Rev.
